



Mobile Communities: Piloting in the Field of Mobile Communication

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The presentation will discuss the promises as well as potential pitfalls of “Mobile Communities”. When looking behind the hype around the term “community” one can see communities as what they are: places that give people a context to communicate and to find like-minded people. In general a community is a group of people who share some interest or another common context, e.g. students in a university department or people interested in chess, soccer or baseball.

Up to now, quite a lot of community support applications have been developed mainly for the use in static, location bound environments. For mobile environments, however, adequate support applications and application experiences do not exist. This is the focus of the COSMOS project¹. The main objective of the project “COSMOS - Community Online Services and Mobile Solutions” is the development of generic services and technologies for operating mobile communities. Therefore, two pilot communities in the domains of Lifestyle and Healthcare are being established.

Together we will discuss what we can expect to learn from such a pilot project in the field of mobile communication.
